

CA TAX CREDIT PROGRAM 3.0

The California Film Commission governs the Film and Television Tax Credit Program which provides tax credits based on qualified expenditures for eligible productions that are produced in California. The \$1.55 billion program runs for 5 years, with a sunset date of June 30, 2025.

Each fiscal year – July 1 to June 30 – the \$330-million funding is categorized in: TV Projects, Relocating TV, Indie Features, and Non-Indie Features.
